For the safety of all students, families and staff, HCPA has put in place many layers of prevention.

"CDC guidance was designed to inform the selection of effective layered prevention strategies and to support them in transitioning learning environments to reflect changes in the level of transmission of COVID-19 occurring in their communities. Schools should maintain awareness of COVID-19 transmission levels in their local community and the vaccination status of the population they serve when making determinations about the use of COVID-19 layered prevention strategies in their facilities".

We encourage all eligible students, families and staff to get vaccinated.

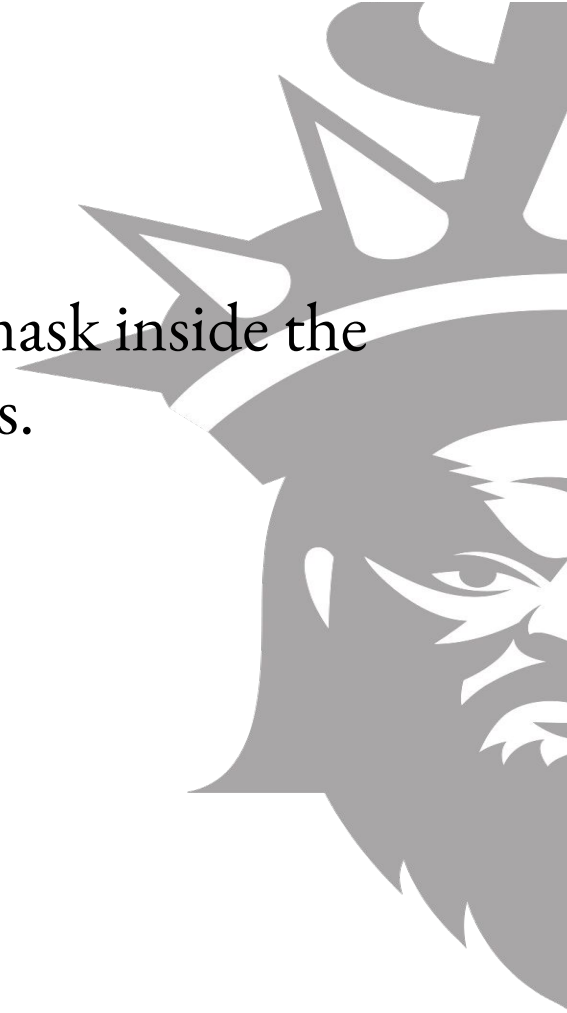




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Face Coverings

All staff, students and visitors must wear a mask inside the building and on school grounds.



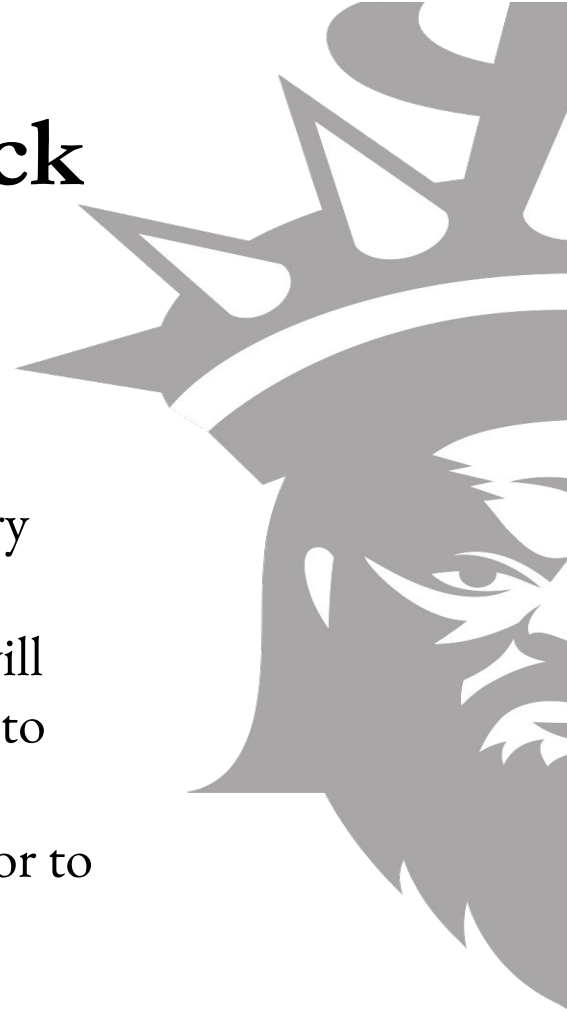
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Stay Home when Sick

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If a Student Develops Symptoms at School

- Teachers are trained to look for common COVID-19 symptoms.
- HCPA's Health Office will evaluate students with Covid-19 like symptoms.
- HCPA has a dedicated isolation room and trained staff to supervise sick students.
- *Parents must pick up students ASAP if called.*

Screening Testing

HCPA is working with MDH to offer screening COVID-19 testing to students and staff on a regular basis.

Physical Distancing

- Maintain at least 3 feet of physical distance between students within classrooms, whenever feasible.
- 6 feet between students and staff
- 6 feet of distance between staff who are not fully vaccinated
- Physical distance will be maximized as much as possible when moving through food service lines and while eating.



Assigned Seating

To minimize the number of students come in contact with, HCPA will assign seating for all K-12 students in the following areas:

- All classrooms
- Pull-out/small group
- Breakfast
- Lunch
- Busses

Sanitization & PPE

Our custodial staff will significantly increase the wiping down and disinfecting of public spaces and high-touch surfaces across our building and throughout the school day.

We will also provide greater access to cleaning materials for our teachers and staff so that they can clean and disinfect spaces, as needed.

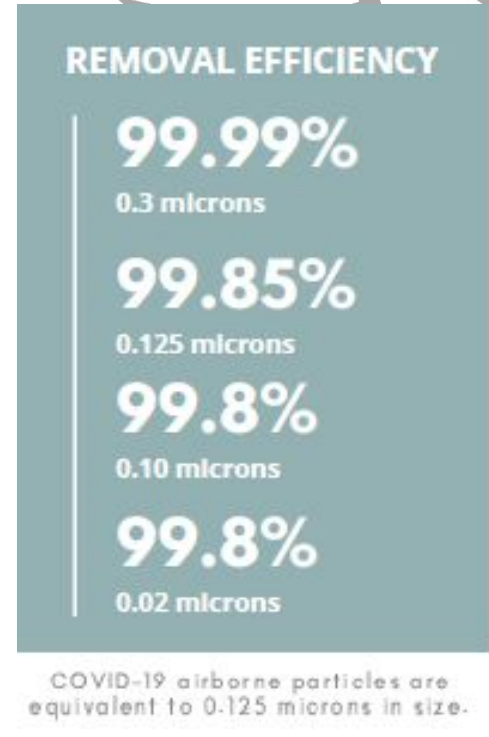
Each classroom will receive a PPE kit including gloves, face shields, extra masks and disinfectant.

Sanitization stations including gloves, masks, and hand sanitizer will be on each floor and placed in high-traffic areas.

Ventilation

Improved ventilation through:

- Newly installed air filters on every heating/cooling system throughout the school.
- Portable air purification devices with hospital-grade HEPA filters will be placed in all high-traffic areas, including cafeterias.



Transportation

Masks

Bus drivers and K-12 students are required to wear masks on the bus.

Assigned Seats

All K-12 students will have assigned seats on the bus.

Health Screening

Families are responsible for checking their student's symptoms before they go to the bus stop.

Windows

Weather permitting, windows will be open to help increase air circulation.
