

Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO)

Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) is a program that allows public and nonpublic students to earn college credit while still in high school, through enrollment in and successful completion of college courses at eligible postsecondary institutions. Students generate both college credit and high school credit by successful completion of the course. Most PSEO courses are offered on the campus of the postsecondary institution; some courses are offered online.

- Students and Parents/guardians should educate themselves about the PSEO program
- Students and Parents/guardians need to be aware of the pros and cons of enrolling in PSEO.

You are eligible if you are in grade 10, 11 or 12, enrolled in high school and meet the admissions requirements of the postsecondary tech school, college or university you wish to attend.

The college/university will determine eligibility.

Skill-sets to Have to be Successful at PSEO

- Self-advocacy
- Self-discipline
- Good study skills / time management skills
 (as a general rule, you will need to spend 2 hours of study time for each hour your are in class)
- An independent learner
- Willingness to seek help when it's needed.
- Pursued the most rigorous high school courses available
- Attend each class every day that it meets

Letting HCPA know

Notification of Intent to Enroll

To assist the district in planning, public school students are required to inform their district of their intent to enroll in PSEO courses during the following school year by May 30.

If public school students do not notify the enrolling district by May 30 and the enrolling district does not waive the deadline, the family may be responsible for the postsecondary tuition expense.

Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO)

Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) is a program that allows public and nonpublic students in 10th, 11th and 12th godes to earn college credit while still in high school, through enrollment and successful completion of college norsectarian courses at eligible postsecondary institutions. Students generate both college credit and high school credit by successful completion of the course. Most PSEO courses are offered on the capus of the postsecondary institution; some courses are offered on the participating college or university sets its own admissions requirements for enrollment into the PSEO courses. Eleventh and 12th grade students may take PSEO courses on a full. Or part-time basis; 10th-grades are eligible to enroll in PSEO on a more limited basis (see note below). Students must meet the PSEO residency and eligibility requirements and abole by participation limits specified in Minnesota Statutics, section 1240.09.

PSEO for 10th-Graders to take Career and Technical Education (CTE) Courses

Legislation allows public and nonpublic 10th grade students to erroll initially in one Career and Technical Education (CTE) course through PSEO. If the student earns a "C" or higher grade in this first course, she/he is eligible to take additional CTE courses while in 10th grade. In order to be eligible, a 10th-grade student must have met the proticiency level of "meets or exceeds" on the Bringside MCA reading test. If the student did not take the MCA, another reading assessment accepted by the enrolling postsecondary institution can be substituted. For students with disabilities, there is an alternative options to demonstrate reading proficiency. Access the Alternate Eligibility Options Policy and Modification Request Form below.

Eligible Courses and Institutions

Courses taken through PSEO must meet graduation requirements at their high school. Only nonsectarian and non-developmental courses are considered eligible by statute. Courses must be offered by Minnesotia PSEO eligible postsecondary institutions sacess the list of <u>Participating Postsecondary institutions</u> for a list of schools and their contact information. Postsecondary institutions are required to allow PSEO students to enroll in online courses consistent with the institution's policy regarding postsecondary student enrollment in online courses.

How to Foroll in PSFO

Students must meet the PSEO eligibility requirements and abide by participation limits outlined in the <u>Postsecondary Enrollment Octoors</u>
<u>Act</u> and explained in the PSEO Reference Guide (below), Interested and eligible 10th, 11th and 12th grate students should contact the postsecondary institution to find out their admissions requirements, which course are offered and with explication process/friending is the third institution. Public school students should meet with their high school coursefor to discuss graduation requirements and the benefits and risks of enrolling in the PSEO program. All students must complete the PSEO Notice of Student Registration (listed at the bottom of this page) for the school year during which they intend to enroll.

Tuition, Fees and Transportation Reimbursements

There is no charge to PSEO students for fution, books or fees for items that are required to participate in a course; however, students may mour fees for equipment that becomes their property when the course or program is completed or for trastbooks that are not returned to the postsecondary institution according to their policies. Public school students may be responsible for fution costs if they do not notify the district by May 30 and the distinct does not wave this dash exquirement.



innesota Statutes, section 1240,09, subdivision 7, requires public school students to inform the district by May 30 of each year of the pupil's intent to enroll in postsecondary courses during the following school year to assist the district in planning. A pupil is bound by notifying or not notifying the district by May 30, unless the public school district has waived the deadline as indicated in Section 2. A public school student who has not met this requirement is not eligible for PSEO funding.

Minnesota Statutes, section 1240.09, subdivision 5, requires the institution to send written notice to the student and the student's school or district. The notice must indicate the course and hours of enrollment of that pupil.

My signature indicates that the student identified in Section 1 is registered this term for the courses indicated above all courses are nonsectarian in content and are not remedial or developmental. Tenth grade students during their first semester of PSEO participation may take only one Career or Technical Education (CTE) course. PSEO location must determine your college level reading readiness.

Accuplacer/Placement Tests

Reading, Writing, and Math test

Students need to schedule a testing time AT the college

Students MUST test at or above college level READING & MATH to do PSEO.

If students do not do well on math or writing ACCUPLACER/Placement Tests, then the recommendation is to not enroll in PSEO.



FIRST THING TO KNOW



- Watch for communication to attend advising and registration session
- PSEO class are not full year in length.
- PSEO classes are one semester long.
- PSEO classes typically award a full year credit in 1 semester (dependent on the credit of the classes)

Do I have to pay?

The costs of tuition, books and lab fees will be covered by the school district as part of your high school education. You will be responsible for payment of non-consumable tools and equipment (example: laptop). The books are to be returned to the college directly, as the books belong to the college. Failure to return books may result in a fine/fee or withholding of your transcript by the college.

SO...HOW MANY CREDITS CAN I TAKE?

That is up to the institution

Some set a number, some leave it open

Key Point You need to take courses that will meet high school credits for graduation.

2ND THING TO KNOW:

Full-time PSEO = PSEO at college/university (12 credits minimum)

or

PSEO and High School = part-time PSEO at college/university (less than 12 credits) and part-time at HCPA



PART TIME OR FULL TIME QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER

If part time....

Start or end your day at HCPA

PSEO class times should be as early as possible, or as late as possible.

Pick classes as early as possible (i.e. 8am class) or late as possible (3pm classes) to avoid potential HS conflicts

If Full time...

Can all high school requirements be taken through PSEOat the college/university?

HOW TO SELECT A COURSE



- Meet with HS counselor BEFORE registering for PSEO classes. (bring signed HCPA PSEO contract)
- Come prepared with PSEO course options.
- Determine which classes you will do at HCPA, and which classes you will do at PSEO for part-time students

Students may select PSEO classes based on future high school courses

Example: PSEO American Literature instead of English 1/1

PSEO Composition instead of English 12

CREDITS and GRADES

Grades from your college/university will be given to HCPA counselors at end of each semester/term.

HCPA will determine the amount of credit to be awarded upon <u>successful completion</u> of the PSEO course.

Make Your College Application Stand Out

Colleges do like to see high school students taking an interest in academics over the summer, and pre-college programs accomplish that.

The program you attend also matters. Some pre-college programs allow anyone to attend, while others are more selective and require you to meet certain college GPA requirements. Selective pre-college programs are more difficult to get interest and are therefore more likely to turn college admissions' heads.



The Takeaway

Pre-college programs are honestly a great way to get a feel for college life and explore your academic interests on a deeper level. For many students, the biggest obstacle is the cost of such programs. If you don't have thousands to drop on a pre-college program, your best bet is to put together a strong application for a free (but often highly-selective) pre-college program.
