




ISEVISR LETER


CLASSROOM NEWS

Middle School Sports:

Middle school volleyball and soccer announced their rosters for the season and are excited to join a league with playoffs and a championship at the end of it for the first time.

Middle school volleyball had their first matches of the year, easily beating Nova Academy. Middle school soccer scored their first victory of the year, narrowly beating Eagle Ridge Academy 4-3, and look to continue the strong start.



Bass Fishing:

2 Teams from HCPA qualified to fish the 2024 MN Junior BASS High School State Championship. Ayden Khang and Ahku Yang formed Team 1 with their boat captain, Danny Khang. Lenny Yang and Joshua Yang formed team 2 with their boat captain, Youa Yang.

At the 2024 MN Junior BASS High School State Championship, there were 67 total teams representing 38 schools throughout Minnesota. The team of Ayden Khang and Ahku Yang placed 2nd Overall out of 67 teams with a total weight of 30.44 lbs. They qualified to fish the 2025 B.A.S.S. High School National Championship.
